Term 4 updates:

Before school clubs have re-commenced this week and are popular. Our Brekky Club on Wednesday mornings includes Toasties and Milo in the courtyard. Its lovely to have these things happening again.

We continue to maximise opportunities for ventilation in all classrooms, with windows and doors being propped open wherever possible. All students continue to be reminded to wash and sanitise their hands and wear their masks as required – strongly recommended for F– 2 and compulsory for Grades 3-6.

COVID Plans:

If our school is designated a Tier 1 exposure site (as notified by DHS), please be assured that I will make direct contact with all families (via email) about what to do. *Individual students and explicit classes identified as Personal Close Contacts (PCCs)* will receive instruction about their isolation requirements from DHS. The intention is to minimise disruption to all school environments.

Bushfire Preparedness work:

The recent rain had been fantastic for the garden, but also brings an awareness about the growth and thus the fire risks ahead. Please consider your personal Fire Safety Plans at home. We have also been practising our emergency evacuation procedures at school. Our school is on the Bushfire At Risk Register (BARR) — Category 3. This means that on a designated Code Red Day our school will be closed.

Planning for 2022:

We have commenced early planning for 2022 school structures. If you are intending to move and your son or daughter will not be attending BPS for 2022, please let us know. Teachers are currently working on grade structures. We intend to still offer our specialist subjects: Art, Music, PE, Gardening and Chinese Mandarin in 2022.

School requisites for 2022: We are currently working on a new approach for the provision of learning items (ie. booklists) for 2022. This will allow families to directly order (on– line), purchase and then collect the items from school on a designated day.

Details will be coming home soon to explain and outline the new process for 2022.

We have been making some changes to the floor plan of the Library at school. Thanks to the efforts of Viv, Freya, Brayden and Charlie last Friday, we now have a large open space to enjoy books!





Maths






